# Offender Management Apprehension Program



Each week, the Huronia West OMAP coordinator circulates information on new warrants and wanted individuals within the community to ensure frontline officers remain informed and alert.

In January 2026, a convicted offender was released to the Huronia West area under two Conditional Sentence Orders that included strict house-arrest conditions which prompted regular compliance checks.

In March 2026, Probation reported concerns that the offender may not be adhering to his conditions. Huronia West OMAP initiated an investigation, working in coordination with the Bail Support Team, CSCU, and the ROPE. Through joint efforts, investigators confirmed the breach, located the offender, and effected an arrest without incident.



The offender was promptly returned to custody, preventing further non-compliance and ensuring community safety.

In April 2026, details were shared regarding a wanted individual known to frequent the Wasaga Beach area. Just 38 minutes after the information was distributed, an officer having reviewed the email, recognized the individual walking in the community and effected an arrest. This demonstrates the value of timely intelligence sharing and proactive engagement by Huronia West members.

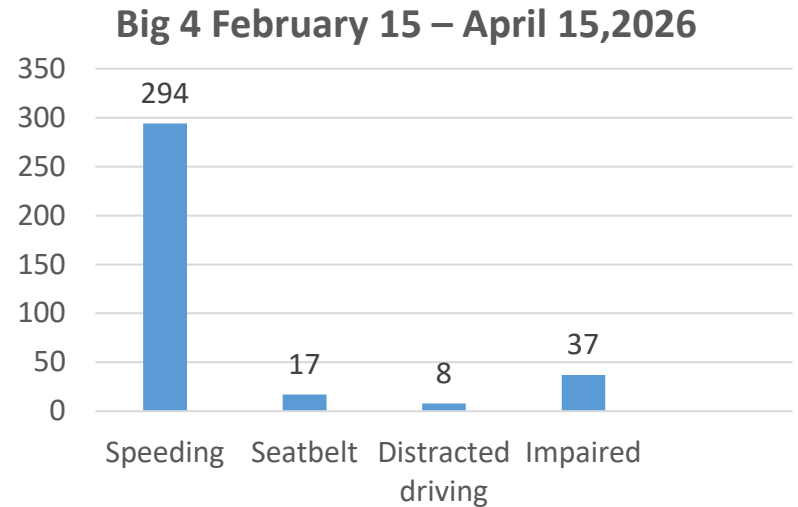
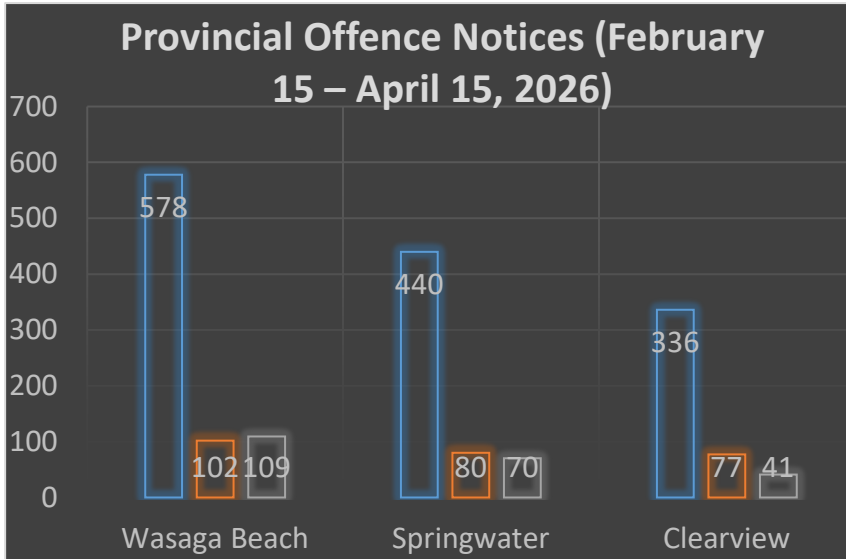

## Easter Long Weekend Traffic Campaign

Huronia West OPP had a successful Easter Long Weekend Traffic Campaign. Officers conducted 150 traffic stops and issued 133 provincial and criminal traffic related charges for a range of offences including 4 impaired charges and over 50 speeding charges!

From February 15 – April 15, 2026, Huronia West OPP issued 20 Impaired charges. All the charges were alcohol related.



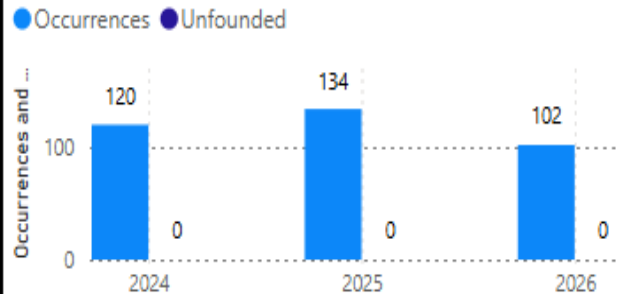

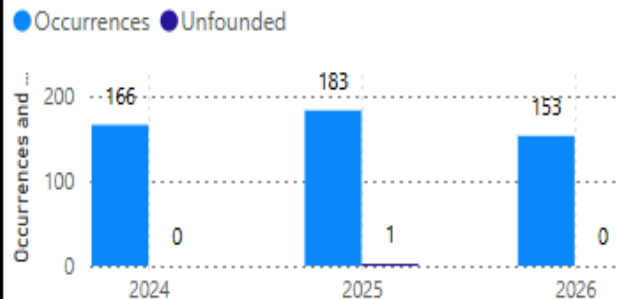

# Community Engagement

# Motorized Snow Vehicle (MSV) Initiatives

- Huronia West OPP Detachment had a successful winter patrolling MSV trails. Over 250 MSV's were stopped for licensing, insurance and trail pass checks.
- Huronia West officers issued more than 20 Provincial Offence Notices during the season, also issuing several educational warnings for future compliance.
- Visibility of law enforcement on trails is the most effective means to increase public and trail safety on Huronia West's well travelled trail system.



# Grant Partnership

## OPP Responsibilities

- The OPP is available to support planning, application development, operational delivery, and reporting.
- Funding cannot flow through OPP via journals, invoices, or other financial mechanisms (except for paid duties).
- Detachments cannot issue invoices without an executed MOU or contract.
- The OPP remains fully committed to collaborating on project planning and development, assisting with applications and reporting through relevant OPP data and statistics and providing operational expertise.

## Municipality Responsibilities

- Municipalities are the eligible applicants and signatories to the TPA (Transfer Payment Agreement), and therefore are responsible for receiving and administering funding, completing required report-backs, ensuring compliance with TPA reporting obligations and conducting appropriate due diligence on any proposed project partners.
- Grant funding flows directly to the municipality.
- If officers' salaries are included in a grant budget, municipalities may use their Municipal Policing Bill for grant report-back purposes and funds remain within the municipalities to offset municipal billing costs.
- Municipalities are strongly encouraged to consider written agreements with external project partners outside of the TPA itself, to clearly define roles, deliverables and financial responsibilities.
- It is essential that municipalities conduct their own review, conflict of interest assessment, and due diligence of any proposed project partners prior to application submissions.
